



Medical Surveillance Program Fact Sheet

The University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) Medical Surveillance Program has been implemented to help prevent occupational disease and to protect the health and safety of its employees. It has also been implemented to meet regulatory requirements, guidelines or established standards of practice pertaining to activities and programs at UIUC. It includes the routine medical examination of employees over a period of time to evaluate occupational exposure to a potential workrelated hazard.

Employees of UIUC are eligible for inclusion in this program if they perform work-related tasks which might be reasonably anticipated to cause occupational exposure to a potential hazard. The medical examinations and tests are provided without cost to the employee and at a reasonable time and place. It is the responsibility of the individual campus unit to bear the full cost associated with the medical examination of its employees. The program does not include pre-employment medical examinations.

At UIUC, the Division of Safety and Compliance (S&C) is responsible for the development and implementation of the Medical Surveillance Program. It is the responsibility of S&C to coordinate the activities of the healthcare provider and campus units. It is also the responsibility of S&C to set up specific medical examinations and tests for a particular hazard in consultation with the healthcare provider. In general, S&C is responsible for the efficient conduct of the program.
