Building Emergency Action Plans

The Facilities & Services' Building Emergency Action Plans (BEAPs) provide guidance on emergency response.

- All F&S personnel have a role in emergency response
- The 2019 update is now in place, and training is beginning
- Access to the F&S BEAPs is provided in the EMERGENCY INFORMATION link in ERIN
- Access to BEAP information for all campus buildings can be found in the <u>EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS</u> tab on the U of I Police Department website

Each BEAP contains the following:

- Emergency Management Team composition and responsibilities
- How the plan is triggered and activated
- Authorities for activation
- Location of the F&S command post and back-ups where information is exchanged with emergency response personnel

Emergency Notifications

Employees in PPSB will be notified of emergencies through the following means:

- Illini-Alerts
- All employee emails
- Fire alarm system for fires. PPSB has a new voice system. Click to listen.
- Air horns sounded by Floor Coordinators for severe weather. Floor Coordinators should blast the horn 3 times, wait 5 seconds, blast the horn 3 times.

If you are not in PPSB, please discuss emergency notifications listed in your BEAP?

Floor Coordinators

- Assist with personnel evacuation and physically account for individuals at evacuation assembly areas
 - Take roster of who is present/missing
 - Report roster to Command Post
- Coordinate rescue assistance
 - Areas where people with special needs can go to await assistance if they are not able to evacuate

Discussion Question 1

It is important to prepare before an emergency happens. Our safety or even our lives could depend on our ability to react quickly. Co-workers with physical limitations may need assistance. We have three options: Run, hide or fight.

Get Out/Run



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Leaving the area quickly is the best option if it is safe to do so.

Leave personal items behind.

If the fire alarm sounds, evacuation is mandatory.

The 3 Evacuation Assembly Areas for the Physical Plant Service Building:

Good Weather	Inclement Weather	Alternate
NW corner of E14	Central Receiving, south end	Waste Transfer Station

Discussion Question 2

How will you get out of the building? What if your primary path is blocked, how will you get out?

Activity 1

We recommend you walk your primary and secondary exit paths now.

Stay In/Hide

When you can't or don't want to run, take shelter indoors. If someone is trying to hurt you and you can't evacuate, get to a place where you can't be seen, lock or barricade your area if possible, silence your phone, don't make noise and don't come out until you receive an Illini-Alert indicating it is safe to do so.

For severe weather events, take shelter before there is an emergency. Severe weather warning are communicated by the National Weather Service and Illini-Alerts.

- Primary storm refuge areas include basements, offices with interior walls, and rooms without windows
- Secondary storm refuge areas include interior hallways with fire doors closed
- Security threat refuges include shops and offices with doors secured

Severe weather refuges areas in public spaces are identified in PPSB using the flag signs shown on the right.

We recommend you locate them now.


Fight

- Think about what kind of common items are in your area which you can use to defend yourself.
- Team up with others to fight if the situation allows.

What is in your area that you can use to fight?




Building Emergency Action Plan (BEAP) - Evacuation Assembly Area Map


PLEASE REMAIN IN THE EVACUATION AREA UNTIL YOU ARE CLEARED TO LEAVE BY AUTHORITIES



Basement Physical Plant Service Building


